Kingdom Report

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The Daniel Persia Template for Southern Africa

There are large economic and strategic and prophetic changes taking place that require analysis and response. My solution is the Daniel governance solution for Persia.

South Africa just had a budget proposed in Parliament that makes it obvious we are in deep economic problems. We have been in a no-growth dead end for years and no prospect for growth while debt and unemployment grow along with the increasing collapse of the critical infrastructure and rule of law.

Issue: Why is this happening in a nation that consists of 83% self identifying Christians?

The consensus of opinion is there will be mo solution to South Africa's problems without the devolution of power away from central government control and devolved to lower structures like cities and provinces.

That needs a constitutional amendment which will not pass the 2/3ds vote in Parliament. How do we address that issue?

International Relations

It is now also evident that the world power system is breaking up into a multipolar world order. A new international Yalta 2.0 will at the soon conclusion of the Ukraine War the strategic defeat of NATO and the re-establishment of the 19th century concept of a world where nations of power have recognized spheres on influence.

America in North and Central Americas. Europe over Western Europe, Russia over Eurasia and East Europe, China and Japan over Asia, India and Brazil in their regions.

And Africa? Like in the 19th century Africa will be raped and pillaged by nations and corporations of minerals and energy sources.

Issues for the Church?

There is by now no prospect for an eschatology that is looking for a One World Empire ruled by a supposed Antichrist. Not in this century if ever. And you can also include the disaster in the Middle East of Israel and the endless war there. At what point do we admit that this is not the Israel that will fulfill Isaiah 62:7 "to be a praise in all the earth" or the Israel to whom the nations of the earth flow to ask "teach us your ways" (Micah 4).

When is the Church of Jesus Christ in Southern Africa going to recognize the real signs of the times of the world we are now living in? And that includes both all signs of the problems we are confronted with as well as all the possible solutions we have in hand.

My Prophetic Template Solution

In my previous book in the prophetic section I used the prophecies in Daniel of the great statue and the 4 beasts as a "Countdown to the Kingdom". What I was doing was I wanted to prove that the Kingdom of God was prophesied to appear in the time of the 4th Kingdom which is the Roman Empire, preceded by Babylon, Persia and Greek empire. I wanted to prove that the Kingdom is not still coming...it has come!

Now I want to use those same empires that were prophesied as a solution to our problems of Southern Africa. They were God's preparation of nations and economies ready for the preaching of the gospel.

Remember that the last of Israel, the kingdom of Judah was taken into captivity in Babylon. And were there in not only during the rule of Babylon but also under the rule and control of Persia from which they were allowed to exodus back to fallen Jerusalem to rebuild the Temple and the City.

Here is my new prophetic template as a solution for the Church in Southern Africa

The empires that the Jews were exiled to were also the foundation upon which the Kingdom of God was to be built after the Day of Pentecost. Look at the list of all the people who heard Peter preach in Acts 2 and of whom 3000 were saved that day and they all came out of these succeeding empires.

But not just that, by the time that Paul could travel safely all over the Roman empire as a Roman citizen and establish churches out of gentiles and Jewish synagogues all the previous empires of Persia and Greece had already laid the foundations of peace and prosperity that made it possible.

We need an empire solution for Southern Africa's problems. An empire like Persia. Like a Persian Empire organized and run by Daniel as the Prime Minister under king Darius.

Dan 6:1-3 It pleased Darius to set over the kingdom an hundred and twenty satrapss, which should be over the whole kingdom; And over these three presidents; of whom Daniel was first: that the satraps might give accounts unto them, and the king should have no damage. Then this Daniel was preferred above the presidents and satraps, because an excellent spirit was in him; and the king thought to set him over the whole realm.

I want to give you a dramatic description of the prosperity and government and economic and social revolution of Persia under Darius and Daniel. Daniel had God's divine wisdom to re-organize the politics and economy of Persia for the foundation of prosperity and peace needed for preaching the gospel effectively.

Before I do that here is the size of our Promised Land Empire of the new USAL

The Union of Southern Africa. The nations of the Southern Africa Development Community. The same SADC already bound together by numerous economic and political treaties. And I will compare it to the United States.

The 16 nations that constitute the SADC. These member states are: Angola, Botswana, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Eswatini, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Seychelles, South Africa, Tanzania, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. The combined land area of all 16 SADC member states totals approximately 9,672,702 square kilometers (3,734,651 square miles) According to the most recent comprehensive data available, the total population of all 16 SADC member states was estimated at 363,222,621 as of 2020

In comparison, the United States of America covers a land area of approximately 9,147,420 square kilometers (3,531,837 square miles) The United States has a slightly smaller population, with 2024 estimates placing it at approximately 340,110,988 residents.

I am about to provide you a copy of some of my research on the Persian Empire under Darius and Daniel.

My point is this.

An empire like this was a multinational empire of various nations and people. Like every empire it draws a line of protection around these people to protect them from outside invasion and it stops them from fighting among themselves,

It establishes law and order across the empire, secures families and promotes commerce and property rights.

That is what Daniel did as Prime Minister for a huge multinational conglomeration of peoples and nations.

And that is what we need to do for the people and nations of the SADC community. If we do this we can change the various constitutions. Read bellow all the innovations that Daniel made for the Persian empire.

Now imagine how this helped Nehemiah and Ezra when they were allowed to rebuild Jerusalem and the Temple and run the province of Judea in the Persian empire according to God's laws as an example to the other 119 provinces and think of this as a strategy by which we can create prosperity and protection for the people of Southern Africa. While the new world order is dividing up the world in spheres of influence...lets make Southern Africa God's sphere of influence with the riches of our continent to be used for our people and for the Kingdom of God.

The Achaemenid (Persian) Empire

The Achaemenid Empire, founded by Cyrus the Great in 550 BCE, represented an unprecedented territorial expansion for its time. According to historical records, the empire encompassed approximately 5.5 million square kilometers (2.1 million square miles) at its height. This made it the largest empire the world had seen up to that point in history.

This empire, spanning from the Indus Valley to the Mediterranean Sea, introduced remarkable innovations in provincial administration, transportation networks, and economic policies that transformed the ancient world.

The Achaemenid Empire employed a revolutionary provincial system that balanced centralized authority with local autonomy. This administrative framework divided the vast empire into regional units called satrapies, each governed by an appointed official known as a satrap.

The organization of these provinces represented a sophisticated approach to managing diverse territories. Each satrapy operated with a three-part leadership structure: a civil governor (the satrap) who administered regional affairs, a military general who managed defense and recruitment, and a state secretary who maintained official records

This division of powers created an effective system of checks and balances that prevented any single official from accumulating too much power, thereby reducing the risk of rebellion. Both the military commander and state secretary reported directly to the central government as well as to the satrap, creating multiple channels of accountability

Under Darius I, who ascended to the throne in 522 BCE, the empire's governance was systematically reorganized to address three critical priorities: maintaining military strength, establishing economic stability, and implementing a coherent legal system

One of the most significant innovations was the development of a governance model that respected local customs while maintaining imperial cohesion. Rather than imposing Persian customs uniformly across conquered territories, the Achaemenids allowed substantial cultural and administrative autonomy within each province. This pragmatic approach enabled the efficient management of diverse populations from Egyptians to Greeks within a unified imperial framework The empire further strengthened central oversight through the institution of royal inspectors known as "the eyes and ears of the king," who travelled throughout the provinces reporting on local conditions

This system of imperial surveillance helped maintain standards of governance while allowing the central authority to address issues before they escalated into major problems.

The Achaemenid Empire developed an unparalleled transportation and communication infrastructure that physically united its vast territories and facilitated rapid information exchange. The most famous of the empire's transportation achievements was the Royal Road . This highway stretched approximately 2,500 kilometers, connecting Susa (in modern Iran) to Sardis (in modern Turkey). The road was constructed to such high standards that mounted couriers could travel its entire 1,677-mile length in just nine days—a journey that would take an ordinary traveller about three months on foot.

Beyond the main Royal Road, the empire developed an extensive network of secondary routes that connected local economies and integrated distant regions into the imperial system. These secondary routes were vital for regional commerce and administrative communication, creating economic connections between diverse parts of the empire.

The empire established the world's first systematic postal service, based on a network of relay stations called Chapar Khaneh.

The Achaemenid Empire introduced sophisticated economic policies that facilitated trade, standardized commercial practices, and generated imperial revenue through innovative taxation systems.

Under Darius I, the empire revolutionized economic transactions by introducing the world's first bimetallic monetary standard. The Persian daric (gold) and siglos (silver) established a stable currency system that facilitated both imperial and private commerce

This monetization of the economy represented a major advancement over the primarily barter-based systems of earlier empires.

Darius also standardized weights and measures throughout the empire, creating consistent commercial standards that merchants could rely upon when trading across provincial boundaries

This standardization reduced transaction costs and uncertainty in commercial dealings, promoting increased trade throughout the empire.

The Achaemenids implemented an innovative taxation system that was carefully calibrated to each province's economic capacity and resources. Rather than imposing uniform tax rates across the empire, the central government assessed each satrapy based on its productivity and economic potential. This sophisticated approach maximized revenue while minimizing economic disruption.

The system was remarkably tailored to regional capabilities. For example, Babylon was assessed for the highest tribute (1,000 silver talents plus four months' food supply for the army), reflecting its exceptional wealth. Egypt was primarily required to provide 120,000 measures of grain in addition to 700 talents of silver, capitalizing on its agricultural productivity. India, famous for its gold reserves, was taxed accordingly

. This system of specialized taxation demonstrated remarkable economic sophistication and knowledge of regional resources.

While traditional agriculture remained the foundation of the empire's economy, specialized industries flourished under Achaemenid rule. The silk industry became particularly significant, with production centered in Khuzestan achieving sufficient scale to supply both domestic needs and generate exports to Mesopotamia and western empires

Trade expanded dramatically under the secure conditions provided by imperial rule. Merchants moved diverse goods throughout the empire, with Babylonian traders playing a central role due to their strategic location. The empire's networks facilitated the movement of iron, copper, tin, and silver from Asia Minor; gold and ivory from Egypt; wine from Phoenicia; and even gold from distant Siberia

These Persian innovations would influence subsequent empires, including the Seleucids, Parthians, Sassanians, and even the Romans, demonstrating the lasting impact of Achaemenid administrative genius on the development of imperial governance.
